Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. In all classes wherein the rules of the USEF do not apply, the horse show management shall settle any dispute or question and the decision shall be Final. Exhibitors and other participants herein, as a condition of admission, shall consent to such methods of settlement. GR 901.9 states that:

Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2)exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

The horse show management reserves the right to itself, to refuse, limit, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries; disqualify any riders or exhibitors thereby canceling awarded prizes/ to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to change rings or officials, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants and to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind.

Warning

Under Iowa Law, a domesticated animal professional is not liable for damages suffered by, an injury to, or the death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks of domesticated animal activities pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 673. You are assuming inherent risks of participating in this domesticated animal activity.

Dogs

Per USEF GR1301.6 - dogs are not permitted to be loose on the competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are soley responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dog's behavior. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 & 7, as well as issuance of yellow warning cards. By Mason City ordinance and the NIEC policy, loose dog rules are strictly enforced locally!

Parking

In designated areas only, and NO PARKING IN FIRE LANES. Show management reserves the right to ask anyone to move their cars, trucks, trailers and vans at any time.

Golf Carts

Golf carts will be available. A lease agreement must be signed. Please call ahead to reserve one. The supply is limited. Please reserve one early.

Concessions

Available on grounds.

Health

Following current horse health & disease prevention protocol, & by requirement of Iowa Law, the North Iowa Event Center and MSHS, all horses must have a health certificate of inspection issued within 30 days of arrival and proof of negative coggins test.

Mid States Horse Shows Bio-Security Policy

We at Mid States Horse Shows, LLC wish everyone and their horses a safe and fun show season! In that light, we have initiated the following bio-security policies to help promote the health and safety of our valued equine partners.

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

All horses arriving for the Mid States Horse Shows competitions that are held at the North Iowa Events Center in Mason City, IA MUST possess and present certificates of veterinary inspection (commonly known as health certificates) issued within 30 days prior to arrival. Certificates are to be presented in the office, where a copy will be kept on file, before any competition numbers will be issued.

NO EXCEPTIONS.

Vaccination Records

Proof of vaccination for all horses is required in the following capacity:

Within 1 year of entry:

- 1. Eastern and Western Equine Encephalomyelitis
- 2. Tetanus
- 3. West Nile
- 4. Rabies (suggested but not mandatory)

Within 6 months of entry:

- 1. Equine Influenza
- 2. Equine Rhino Pneumonitis (EHV 1 & 4)

Suggested and respectfully requested within 3 months of entry:

- 1. Equine Influenza
- 2. Equine Rhino Pneumonitis (EHV 1 & 4)

Mid States has provided an Equine Event Vaccination Card below for your convenience. Proof of Vaccination and/or the Equine Event Vaccination Card must be presented to the office, where a copy will be kept on file, before any competition numbers will be issued. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Liability/Loss/Injury

Neither the sponsor beneficiary, show grounds, show committee or show management or their respective officers will be liable for 1) injuries sustained in any way to exhibitors, spectators, sub contractors or employees; 2) any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, destroyed, stolen or injured in any manner – although every precaution will be undertaken to protect the property of the exhibitors; 3) Any loss or damage that may occur to any horse on the grounds. Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the horse show management. By participating in the show in any way, to include spectator, exhibitor, rider, trainer, agent, or employee or agent of any of the above agree to hold Mid States Horse Shows, LLC, the North Iowa Fairgrounds and their officials, the beneficiary, the USEF Federation and their officials, directors, employees and agents harmless for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the show whether or not such injury or loss resulted directly or indirectly from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees or agents of the show, the beneficiary, or the USEF Federation. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s) or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

In the event of an acute and serious injury to or illness of a horse on competition grounds when the owner or trainer of the horse or agent of the owner is not present, after reasonable effort to contact that individual has been made, competition management, in consultation with a licensed equine veterinarian, may authorize the provision of emergency veterinary treatment of the horse. If competition management so authorizes treatment under the provisions of this rule, competition management and veterinarian are not liable for any resulting costs, damages, losses, claims or actions arising directly or indirectly from the treatment of the horse.

Refunds

Prior to arrival on the show grounds, entry fees minus \$40 office fee shall be refunded if horse/rider is unable to participate. Stall fees shall not be refunded after closing date. After arrival, a Show Scratch refund for a horse's entries, less the \$40 fee may be granted with a signed vet certificate indicating the inability, and reason(s) thereof, for the horse not being able to compete. Entry refunds resulting from the cancellation/rescheduling of classes due to extreme weather or an act of God, may be given only at the sole discretion of show management.

Lungeing

Lungeing is permitted in designated areas and NOT on grass. PLEASE, NO lungeing in any areas DURING or AFTER tractor ring work, unless in specified and/or designated area.

Responsibility

All owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents, employees and animals to stalls, buildings and any other properties on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly.

Medical Waste

Due to Federal Regulations, all medical waste must be separated. Receptacles are provided for disposal of hypodermic needles in aisle of barns. Failure to use them will result in a \$100 fine. Please do not mix with manure waste or trash cans.

Ring/Exhibitor Conduct

If the courtesy circle is restricted, it shall be announced, and also be indicated on the course diagram. A corresponding barrier will be erected in the arena. If said restrictions are not observed, the rider shall be disqualified. Jumping orders will be posted at the in-gate. Jumping orders will be pre-posted and rolled. Post entries will be added to the top of the jump order. Please advise the paddock master of any conflicts.

Membership, Measurement & Amateur Cards

All participants (riders, drivers, handlers, owners, trainers, coaches, agents or lessees) must present to the competition secretary a current USEF/USHJA membership card or copy thereof, or he/she will be assessed a \$30 (or \$60 if both USEF and USHJA) non refundable, show pass fee (non member fee). All junior and pony hunters must possess and present to the horse show office, a current USEF measurement card. All Amateur-owners and adult Amateurs must present their Amateur cards at the time of number pick up. To speed processing, please enclose photocopies of these cards with entries

Adds/Scratches during show

Declare all classes by 5:00 p.m. the day before classes are held. A transaction fee of \$5 per add/scratch sheet will be charged if changes are made on the same day as classes are held. Any entry riding in a class in which they have not been entered will be charged a \$25 rode without entering charge.

Trainer Splits

Mid States Horse Shows offers a service to trainers that allows the trainer to purchase shavings, feed, tack stalls, paddocks, golf carts etc. directly from the Horse Show and then split the total amount for some or all of these items and have it charged directly to their client's horse show bill. Only dollar amounts will be split (not quantities) Trainer splits will be accepted until noon on Friday (no exceptions) of each show week.

Feed & Bedding

Feed and bedding is available through the horse show office. For deliveries prior to arrival, please call the horse show office at 402-689-0669. Exhibitors who bring their own shavings will be charged a \$25.00 per horse disposal fee.

Entry Policies

Entries Close April 13 for Spring, May 18 for Summer & Summerfest and August 24 for Fall.

Entries must be properly made on the financial entry form with all blanks Filled in where applicable. The following must accompany entry form.

1. Stabling fees – non refundable after entries close. (\$175.00) (\$190.00 if fees are received after closing date)

2. Office Charge (\$40.00)

3. Check made payable to: MID STATES HORSE SHOWS, LLC

Entries postmarked after closing date for each show will be considered Late Entries and a one time Late Fee of \$50.00 Per HORSE will be charged. Post entries close at the start of the preceding class. Shippers will be charged a stall, Non Showing and office/facility fee. The office will accept no entries on Sunday after 9:00 am. Same horse is ineligible to enter both split portions of a section. Show office hours on Tuesday will be 10:00 – 7:00 p.m. On Wednesday through Sunday, office hours are 7:00 a.m. until show closes, unless otherwise notified.

PLEASE NOTE: Open checks will be written for the stall fee plus office charge.

Professionals

Please read this and inform your customers that exhibitor's numbers will not be issued by the secretary until entry forms are correctly and completely filled out and arrangements for payment are completed. All trainers are required to leave an open check in the horse show office at check in.

Parents

If not accompanying minor, please send Permission for Medical Treatment (responsibility for care) w/ trainer or responsible adult.

Horse Registration Numbers

See USEF Rules GR 1101,1102. All horses competing in Federation non breed restricted licensed competitions with hunter, hunter breeding, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes must be properly identified and must obtain a Registration Number from the USHJA. Applications for Registration Numbers can be completed online at www.ushja.org or www.usef.org using the Horse Registration application form HORSES MUST STILL BE RECORDED WITH THE USEF (EITHER LIFETIME OR ANNUAL) TO RECEIVE NATIONAL OR ZONE POINTS. See USEF Rules EQ 100.2, HU 101.1, And JP 100.2.

Schooling

When mounted, all riders must wear protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. ALL HORSES MUST LEAVE ANY AREA upon entrance of tractor for ring preparation, and NO additional schooling in rings after tractor work preparation for show day, or lungeing anywhere other than designated areas, after tractor work.

Schooling Hours:

Tuesday: 10:30 A.M - 7:00 P.M.

Wednesday - Saturday (If) designated open for schooling. (Arenas will close 45 minutes prior to show time)

Sunday: THERE WILL BE NO SCHOOLING IN ANY ARENAS.

Some arenas will be open for schooling during posted hours beginning at 10:30 AM on Tuesday preceding the show. Schooling in Grand Prix Ring and Main Hunter Ring may be limited or closed, especially in cases of wet or inclement weather.

Stabling

Stalls are permanent & temporary inside permanent barns. All stalls have fronts. First bedding is not included in the stabling fee. No refunds unless stalls are canceled by closing date of each horse show. Barns will be open on Monday preceding the show at 1:30pm. Barns will close on Monday after the show at 10:00 AM No horse or pony may be stabled overnight in a trailer or van on the show grounds. Be sure to add stabling information to entry form. Every horse will be charged a stall fee, unless specifically arranged with management. Stabling needs? Call Patrice Urban (402) 689 0669.

Golf Carts and Motorized Vehicles

USEF Rule GR1301.7. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside, will NOT be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s) or guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and Charges being Filed against any of these individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance equipment for people with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Trophies - Prize Money - Ribbons

Eight ribbons will be offered in every class, unless specified. Championships and reserve will be awarded according to GR 808.6 for hunter, The points method, JP 110.2 is used for jumper and equitation divisions. Bonus point classes may be used to break Championship ties. JUMPER TIES FOR OTHER THAN FIRST PLACE WILL HAVE TIME BE THE DECIDING FACTOR. Amount of prize money awarded in the class is stated right after the class number in specifications of the section. See schedule below. Premium checks may be picked up at the secretary's office when you are ready to leave and when your bill has been paid in full. However, management reserves the right to mail checks after the conclusion of the horse show. Premiums can be subtracted from payment due.

Attire and Equipment

It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/ jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. See USEF GR 801.

The USHJA National Hunter Derby is open to all horses and ponies; however distances will not be adjusted for ponies. For complete specifications see USEF Rule Book HU189 and the USHJA Programs Department. (Available on the USHJA website.) Class to consist of a two round format, scored by two judges who sit together. The numerical scores from each round will be added together to get the overall point total for each horse. Round One will be a Hunter Classic Course – to consist of a minimum of ten obstacles, fence heights 3' with four option fences set at 3'5". The Second round is the Handy Hunter Round – a minimum of eight obstacles, fence height 3' with four option fences set at 3'5". A minimum of twelve entries, including horses tied for twelfth place, must return for round two, if available. Final placings will be decided by adding together the scores from the two rounds. All riders from the top eight placing horses (or their designated representative) must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money. Riders, owners and trainers must be current, active members of the USEF and USHJA before the start of the class. HORSES MUST BE RECORDED WITH THE FEDERATION AND REGISTERED WITH THE USHJA PRIOR TO THE START OF THE CLASS. Zone bonus points will be awarded to each horse's respective hunter section as declared at the time of entry. Points accrued by horses shown by professionals may be awarded to the declared Pre-Green section or Performance Hunter 3'3". Points accrued by horses shown by Juniors or Amateurs will be awarded to the applicable Children's, Pony, Adult Amateur or Amateur-Owner 3'3" section. National bonus points will not be awarded. Horses/ponies are not required to jog for soundness. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the judges' scores. Formal attire is required per HU 127; in additional hunt colors coat or financial sponsor or team coat is permitted.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS OF THIS CLASS In order for National Hunter Derby points to be awarded, a USHJA Exhibitor Declaration form must be completed and submitted to the Horse Show Office at least one hour prior to the start of the class. If the Declaration Form is not received, riders/horses will receive no points for the class. During the two phases of the class, all horses entered must be ridden only in the designated National Hunter Derby warm up area(s) wearing their competition number. This includes horses simultaneously entered in another class, if any. Entered horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds or NOT wearing their competition number will be eliminated from competing in the classic and the entry fee will be forfeited.

JUMPERS

Management reserves the right to change jumper tables, after due notice to exhibitors. Jump orders will be computer drawn.

Ties other than for first place shall have time be the deciding factor.

The Points Method in JP 110.2 will be used for determining jumper championships.

Stake Classes are awarded bonus points and such classes' points may be used to break ties for championships.

Horses **must** compete in at least 1 or 2 other classes in the section to be eligible for **stake** classes, see class specifications.

The order of go for the first class each day will be posted the night before.

All horses showing in 1.15m and above Jumper Classes, EXCEPT CHILDREN'S/ADULT CLASSES must be nominated and a nominating fee of \$130.00 paid by the closing date of entries. 

OPPORTUNITY

Entrants in Opportunity classes only, are not required to have USEF/USHJA membership, pay show pass fees or other Federation fees, and their mounts are not required to be registered/recorded with USHJA or USEF respectively, but are required to pay all other fees. If riders or horses enter ANY classes at the show, OTHER than Opportunity classes, they ARE required to have all necessary memberships and requirements, and pay all required Federation fees. Riders in Opportunity classes may not show in any USEF rated classes. Riders may cross enter into unrated classes for which eligible, if the height of fences does not exceed 2'6", but horses and riders must then have USEF/USHJA memberships or pay the show pass fees, and they must pay the drug, zone, and any other, required USHJA/USEF fees.

- If the rider has EVER shown in any USEF rated Hunter, Jumper or Hunt Seat Equitation class (Zone pointed or regular) they are ineligible to show in Opportunity classes. For questions, please check with the show secretary.
- Only the top ten INHJA approved shows for riders in each section, count toward INHJA year-end awards.
- Entries must show in at least three MHJA approved shows to be eligible for a MHJA year-end award.
- For the Opportunity classes, attire may consist of proper hunter/jumper show attire or the following: breeches with paddock boots and half chaps; jodhpurs with paddock boots; or breeches and boots. Jumpers may wear a polo shirt or other shirt with sleeves and a collar. Hunter/Equitation riders may wear a shirt with tie or a show shirt with a choker. Depending on the weather, they may wear a close fitting sweater, jacket or vest. All riders must wear SEI/ASTM approved head gear.
- Eligibility for year-end awards from the INHJA, requires an INHJA membership of "Reach Out" level or above. Points will count from shows approved for such, by the INHJA.
- To be eligible for year-end award from the MHJA, you will need to join the MHJA as a competition member to be eligible for points judged on the rider (equitation classes). For points to count in the hunter and jumper classes, the OWNER of the horse must be a Competition member of the MHJA.

In accordance with GR1111.4: All members may compete for Zone Awards or money in any state contiguous to Zone 6: MT, WY, CO, KS, MO, IL, MI and Canada.

ADULT AMATEUR WORKING HUNTER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies. Cross Entry: Riders can cross enter between the Amateur Owner 3'3" and 3'6", but horses may not cross enter between the Adult Amateur and Amateur Owner Hunter sections at the same competition. Riders in the Adult Amateur section may ride a different horse in the Amateur Owner section, and may ride in any section for which they are eligible at the same show. Judging: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count. Height of Fences: Not to exceed 3' spreads must not exceed the fence height. Combining/Dividing Sections: To be offered in three age groups Adult Amateur 18-35, Adult Amateur 36-49 and Adult Amateur 50 & Over. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in an age group, it is to be combined with the other age group that has the least number of entries. The Adult Amateur and Children's Hunter sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) in any of these sections. The Adult Amateur and Children's Hunter Pony sections may not be combined. Jog: Horses and Ponies are not required to jog for soundness. Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the Adult Amateur Hunter 18-35 section, the Adult Amateur 36-49 section and the Adult Amateur 50 & Over section.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year. Cross Entry: Horse-and-rider combinations entered in this division may not cross enter into the Junior Hunter division at the same competition unless it is the rider's first year of showing in the Junior Hunter division. Riders entered in the Children's Hunter may not cross enter at the same competition in classes in which the jumps exceed 3'6", except in Children's Jumper classes where the height of the fences does not exceed 1.15m. Judging: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count. Height of Fences: Not to exceed 3'0"; spreads not to exceed height of fence. Combining/Dividing Sections: If entries warrant, it is recommended that this division be split by age into two sections: Children's Hunter Horse 13 & Under, Children's Hunter Horse 14 -17. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in an age group, it is to be combined with the other age group that has the least number of entries. The Children's Hunter Horse and Adult Amateur sections may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) in any of these sections. The Children's Hunter Horse and Children's Hunter Pony sections may not be combined. Jog: Horses and Ponies are not required to jog for soundness. Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the Children's Hunter Horse 13 and Under section and Children's Hunter Horse 14-17 section.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year. Cross Entry: Riders may not cross enter into any USEF rated classes at the same competition where the height of fences exceeds 3'3". Riders may cross enter into Pony Jumpers regardless of fence heights. Ponies may cross enter into rated pony sections. Judging: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count. Height of Fences: Small/ Medium ponies: 2'0" and Large Pony: 2'6".

Jog: Horses and Ponies are not required to jog for soundness. Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the Chil-

dren's Hunter Pony-Small/Medium section and the Children's Hunter Pony-Large section.

PRE-GREEN

Refer to HU106.3.

Awards: Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the Pre-Green 3'0" section and the Pre-Green 3'3" section. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** A show may combine height sections in one division with both heights offered. If sections are combined, points will be awarded in the height section in which the horse competed.

Adult Equitation 18-35, Adult Equitation 36 & Over, Refer to GR1131.11

Equitation 11 & Under, Equitation 12-14, Equitation 15-17 **Eligibility:** To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year. **Cross Entry:** No cross entry restrictions **Judging:** To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count. **Height of Fences:** Equitation 11 & Under: not to exceed 2'6", Equitation 12-14: not to exceed 3'0", Equitation 15-17: not to exceed 3'6". **Combining/Dividing Sections:** Sections of equitation for junior exhibitors may not be combined. Each age group shall be run separately regardless of the total number of entries. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the Equitation 11 & Under section, Equitation 12-14 section and Equitation 15-17 section.

LOW CHILDREN'S JUMPER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year. Open to horses and ponies. Cross Entry: Riders in Low Children's Jumper may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m (3'9") at the same competition. Horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the High Children's Jumpers at the same competition and on the same day as showing in Low Children's Jumpers. Horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both Low and High are offered.

(If a RIDER competes in the LOW Children's section, they may NOT compete ABOVE 1.15m at the same show, but MAY also compete in the HIGH Children's section(s) on the same horse &/or any, otherwise eligible horse, and on the same day.) **Combining/Dividing Sections:** Low Children's and Low Adult Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than 3 in either section and may combine if there are

fewer than 6 in either section. If after combining the Low sections there are fewer than 3 entries then competition management must further combine the Low sections with the High sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height.

Height of Fences: 1.00m (3'3"). Awards: Zone awards to be given for Low Children's Jumper section.

LOW ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies. Cross Entry: Riders in Low Adult Amateur Jumper may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.15m (3'9") at the same competition. Horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the High Adult Amateur Jumper at the same competition and on the same day as showing in Low Adult Amateur Jumpers. Horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both Low and High are offered. (If a RIDER competes in the LOW Adult Amateur section, they may NOT compete ABOVE 1.15m at the same show, but MAY also compete in the HIGH Adult Amateur section(s) on the same horse &/or any, otherwise eligible horse, and on the same day.)Combining/Dividing Sections: Low Children's and Low Adult Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than 3 in either section and may combine if there are fewer than 6 in either section. If after combining the Low sections there are fewer than 3 entries then competition management must further combine the Low sections with the High sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. Height of Fences: 1.00m (3'3"). Awards: Zone awards to be given for Low Adult Amateur Jumper section.

HIGH CHILDREN'S JUMPER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year. Open to horses and ponies. Cross Entry: Horse/Rider combinations in High Children's Jumper may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.30m at the same competition. If after combining the High sections there are fewer than 3 entries then competition management must further combine the High sections with the Low sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. Height of Fences: 1.05m (3'5") through 1.15m (3'9"): Recommended to be conducted as a progressive section and/or offered as multiple sections at different heights. Awards: Zone awards to be given for High Children's Jumper

HIGH ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER

Eligibility: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies. Cross Entry: Horse/Rider combinations in High Adult Amateur Jumper may not cross enter into any classes held above 1.30m at the same competition. Horse/rider combinations may cross enter into the Low Adult Amateurs Jumpers at the same competition and on the same day. Horse/rider combinations may enter only one classic, if both Low and High Adult Amateur Jumper Classics are offered. Riders may cross enter into Amateur Owner and Amateur Owner/Junior combined or other jumper classes, if otherwise qualified; up to 1.35m (4'5") max on a different mount(s) provided they have not competed in the Low Adult Amateur Jumper at the same competition. (FOR EXAMPLE: Provided the RIDER does NOT compete in any class ABOVE 1.15m at the same show, the RIDER may also compete in the LOW Ad/Am section on the same horse &/or any, otherwise eligible horse, and on the same day. If the RIDER does NOT compete in the LOW Ad/Am section at the same show, RIDER/HORSE COMBINATION(s) may also compete in any other classes, if otherwise eligible {including Low AO}, up to, but not above 1.30m at the same show, & the RIDER may also compete in classes up to, but not above 1.35m on a DIFFERENT horse(es) if otherwise eligible, at the same show, {including High AO, if it is NOT above 1.35m}.) If after combining the High sections there are fewer than 3 entries then competition management must further combine the High sections with the Low sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. Height of Fences: 1.05m (3'5") through 1.15m (3'9"): Recommended to be conducted as a progressive section and/or offered as multiple sections at different heights. Awards: Zone awards to be given for High Adult Amateur Jumper section.

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

A Competing Member is entitled to receive all the publications and prize lists, be listed in the directory, participate in M-UA Clinics as a member, and all other regular member benefits, plus the Competing Member and all horses owned by the Competing Member will be eligible for BH-UA Year-End Awards. In order to be eligible for a year-end award in the horse or jumper classes, the <u>owner</u> of the horse must be an MH-UA Competing Member. If you are riding a leased horse, please be sure the <u>owner</u> is an BH-UA member in order for points to count. To be eligible for an equitation award, the <u>rider</u> must be an MH-UA Competing Member.
- Non-Compeling Membership: Dues of \$40.00 per year. A Non-Compeling Member is entitled to receive all
 the publications and prize lists, be listed in the directory and all other regular benefits, except that the NonCompeting Membership <u>does not</u> include eligibility for MHJA Year-End Awards.

Both memberships are from December 1 to November 30, the same as USEF and USELIA. Membership becomes active on its postment date if mailed or date received by a representative of the MELIA if hand delivered. All memberships expire on November 30, regardless of the date activated.
